## **COVID-19 HEALTH PROTOCOL**

Health Pass has been set up by the French government. It is mandatory regardless of the capacity of the venue, from the 1st person. These measures apply for anyone aged 12 and over, whether they are participants (athletes, coaches, referees) or in the audience (spectators, officials). Under the conditions of application described above, the Health Pass exempts from wearing a mask and PCR testing, but not from respecting health protocols in force.

The Health Pass consists of the presentation, digital or paper, of a "health proof", among the following three:

- Proof of vaccination status, attesting to a complete vaccination schedule (see list of vaccines accepted by the European Union below). The digital reading of the QR code presented will be done via the application " TAC Verif " to be downloaded on a smartphone,
- The negative result of an RT-PCR test performed less than 72 hours or an antigen test performed less than 48 hours prior to accessing the event site,
- Proof of recovery, via a positive RT-PCR result of more than 11 days and less than 6 months prior to accessing the venue.

In case of a positive test, an isolation will be set up for 10 days for the positive individual and for 7 days for the contact cases, the cost of this isolation will be paid by the concerned delegation. However, a medical evacuation can be arranged by the individual's delegation.

For delegations arriving from orange- or red-list countries, or delegations from green-list countries not vaccinated with an EMA-authorized vaccine, antigen screening tests will be carried out according to a defined schedule. Weapon control will be done at the same time. For athletes and delegation members the test will be paid for by the organizer.

A PCR test will be possible on this same site, from Friday 21/01 in the morning and until Saturday 22/01 at 12 noon, its cost, of 43.89 €, is the responsibility of the applicant. The results of the tests carried out until Saturday 12 noon will be given in the late afternoon on Saturday itself.

All these prescriptions may be modified depending on the health context.

A certificate of recovery is a document issued to persons who have contracted COVID-19, upon presentation of a positive RT-PCR or antigenic test. It must be dated more than 11 days and less than 6 months prior to the date of arrival.
